

Operator Overloading

- In Java, Only "+" Operator is used for Operator Overloading
- "+" can be used to add integers.
- "+" can also be used to concatenate two sub-strings.
- you cannot have your user defined operator for operator overloading in Java.
- It supports compile time Polymorphism.

Example

```
class oover
{
    public static void main (String args[])
    {
        String msg = "sp" + "Notes";
        System.out.println (msg);

        int result = 10 + 20;
        System.out.println (result);
    }
}
```

Output

====
spNotes
30
